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Longitudinal spin diffusion in a nondegenerate Bose gas JEFFREY MCGUIRK, DORNA NIROOMAND, SEAN GRAHAM, Simon Fraser University — We present results from studies of longitudinal spin diffusion of two pseudo-spin domains in a trapped ^{87}Rb sample above quantum degeneracy, and investigate the effect of the degree of coherence in the domain wall on the dynamics of the system is investigated. Coherence in the domain wall leads to transverse-spin-mediated longitudinal spin diffusion that is slower than classical predictions, as well as altering the domains' oscillation frequency. This spin-system also shows an instability in the longitudinal spin dynamics as the longitudinal and transverse spin components couple, and a conversion of longitudinal spin to transverse spin is observed, resulting in an increase in the total amount of coherence in the system.

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
