Practically all opacity and emissivity studies of molecular plasmas are conducted utilizing data or codes taken from several different sources. To this end, we are developing a fully generalizable self-consistent approach to model cool hydrogen ( $\rm H_2$  and  $\rm H_2^+$ ) plasmas opacity and emissivity. Here we present results of cool hydrogen plasmas emission, and investigate the importance of electronic excited states.
