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Continuing Studies of Hydrogenic Quantum Systems Using the Feynman-Kac Path Integral Method J. M. REJCEK, University of Texas at Arlington — The Feynman-Kac path integral method is applied to the atomic hydrogen quantum system for the purpose of evaluating eigenvalues. These are computed by random walk simulations on a discrete grid. The study provides the latest simulation analysis and includes the use of symmetry that allows higher order eigenstates to be computed.
