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Analysis on the Magnetic and Thermodynamic behavior of a Linear Magnetic Chain [Co(bpdc)(H₂O)₂].H₂O YOUCEF HAMIDA, DUSAN DANILOVIC¹, TAN YUEN, Temple University, QIHAN GONG, JING LI, Rutgers University, DEPT. CHEMISTRY AND CHEMICAL BIOLOGY, RUTGERS UNIVERSITY COLLABORATION — [Co(bpdc)(H₂O)₂].H₂O (bpdc=biphenyldicarboxylate) was found to be a one dimensional ferromagnetic Co (II) chain system that orders below 5.5 K due to a weak antiferromagnetic inter-chain coupling. Classical Fisher Model (CFM), Mean Field Theory (MFT), and Ising Model (IM) were applied to the high temperature susceptibility data of [Co(bpdc)(H₂O)₂].H₂O. The fit to CFM yielded a $J/k_B = + 7.40$ K with $R^2 = 0.993$; MFT gave a $J/k_B = + 5.31$ K with a low $R^2 = 0.391$. The ratio interchain interactions (J') to that of intra-chain interactions was estimated to be $J'/J = - 0.005$. The magnetic specific heat was obtained via direct subtraction of the specific heat data for Zinc analogue from that of [Co(bpdc)(H₂O)₂].H₂O . The magnetic specific heat data was fit to the Ising Model for spin $1/2$ yielding $J/k_B = + 15.27$ K. The interpretations on the spin state of the Co(II) at different temperatures in the compound are consistent with the behavior of Co(II) in other compounds with similar octahedral sites.

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
