They can be found in biological systems like photosynthesis of light, enzymes, and transport proteins. The porphyrins optical spectra can be characterized by the presence of a dominant so called Soret band plus a Q-band structure, whose positions and shapes offer a method to characterize porphyrins in various environments. Here the electronic and spectroscopic properties of tetracationic 5,10,15,20-tetrakis(1-methyl4-pyridyl)-21H,23H-porphyrin (TMPyP) is investigated in the framework of the DFT. The IR and UV-vis spectra are compared with experimental results. The influence of the environment and functional on the UV-vis spectra is investigated. These results are further discussed to tentative address the TMPyP/Clay interaction.
